



R. Scott Seville is a professor in and chairperson of the Department of Zoology and Physiology at the University of Wyoming (UW). He has been involved with IDeA programs since 2003, initially as a Wyoming INBRE investigator, then appointed INBRE Outreach Core Director in 2005, INBRE Program Coordinator in 2007, and Principal Investigator and Program Director in 2015. In these capacities he has been involved in all aspects of INBRE program management and Network development. He has experience with other IDeA programs and currently serves as the Associate Director of the Pilot Projects Program and the UW concierge for the Mountain West Clinical and Translational Research- Infrastructure Network, and on the steering committee of the UW Sensory Biology COBRE. Seville has served as a member of the Board of the National Association of IDeA Principal Investigators since 2017. His research focuses on gastrointestinal protozoan parasite taxonomy, systematics, and evolution. He is author/co-author of 55 scientific papers and co-author of *The Biology and Identification of the Coccidia (Apicomplexa) of the Carnivores of the World* published in 2018 by Elsevier-Academic Press.
